Introduction

The intent of this text is to describe the focus, purpose, and goals for the spiritual journey of the Rocky Mountain Church of Christ. This text is not designed to be a permanent document. Point others to a relationship with God





Growing in the Grace and Knowledge of Jesus Christ

Rocky Mountain Church of Christ is growing. In the past 11 years the congregation has almost doubled in attendance. The church's giving has even seen more growth. These are measuring tools that reflect the outward growth. What can not be seen from these facts is how individuals are growing on the inside. One of the benefits of being a part of the Rocky Mountain Church is our plan to help individuals grow - to grow in the understanding of God's love, the Bible, and the application of that knowledge into their everyday life.

II. Obtaining a Better Relationship with Christ

Objective: Spiritual Maturity Development

Intended Recipients: New and developing member of RMCC

Maturity Ministry Leader: Jerry Botts

The objective of the maturity ministry is to help new members obtain a better relationship with Christ. This can be accomplished through the use of "Second Teach" ministry, small groups, and other fellowship & ministry activities.

A. Suggested Goals

Maturity minister will help new members continue their spiritual journey with Christ. One of the methods of helping them to grow is the study of Jesus' life. All new members should complete the classes.

- Provide 2nd Teach Program to all new members.
- Train leaders for 2nd Teach Program at least once a year.
- New Beginnings classes.
- Teach Discovering Spiritual Maturity Classes (201)
- All members integrate into the LIFE of our Small Group Ministry.
- Teach the Life Group leader training course at least once a year.

B. Things needed to accomplish above tasks

• Revise and edit 2nd Teach material.

III. Becoming a vessel in Christ hand

Objective: To help individual members to discover, develop, and use their talents.

Recipients: Individual members who want to express their appreciation to God.

Ministry leader: Eric Creel

Our objective is to help every member to find his or her gifts, talents, and abilities, and then create an effective ministry that will utilize those individual abilities.

"Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms" (1 Peter 4:10).

A. Suggested Goals

- Teach Ministry Course at least once a year.
- Help each member complete their SHAPE (Spiritual Gifts, Heart, Abilities, Personality, and Experience) profile and discover individual ministries. Updated at least once a year.
- Develop a Ministry Fair once a year with sign-up sheets and brochures to highlight each ministry as a means of informing and recruiting people for individual ministries – early winter
- Keep records of the SHAPE database that lists members' spiritual gifts and their scores from the York Gifts Analysis.
- Develop community service outreach projects for Church and for life groups in 2007
 - Do several "God's Love" projects
 - Do Community Service to Elderly and Single Moms
- Collect Items For Food Share
- Organize 3 "Bring Your Neighbor Day Sundays"
- Teach Ministry Material 301, or other material.

- Begin a Prison Ministry
- Assist other churches with their work in evangelism and growth as requested.
- Begin planting seeds for church plantings in Montana.
- Reaching out to other Churches in the Area



Vision 2007 Summary

The Rocky Mountain Church of Christ has experienced decline and growth over the past 11 years. During the past year the church has plateaued and has now started to grow again. Exciting times are ahead. During the month of January, 2007 our attendance has steadily climbed. Our giving has increased by 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ times. People are excited and anticipation is growing for the coming year.

The land purchase has been completed. Excitement about have a new building to use for His glory is growing. We dream and plan of ways to use that facility to bring glory to our Lord. Ideas have been suggested in the sharing of this Vision. There are still other ideas and dreams that need to be shared and dreamed. Together these goals and dreams can be accomplished, but only with the involvement of everyone.

The church is the body of Christ. It takes all the parts of the body working together in order for the body to function as it should. All parts of the body are important; there are no dispensable parts. As the church works together, it reflects the glory of our Lord. Each day each person is a reflection of their part of the body. - 9. Leadership development; Life Groups, Second Teach, Leadership
- 10. Development of a four (4) year vision plan for the church.
- 11. Conduct 100, one-on-one studies this year.
- 12. Contact every visitor that attends.
- 13. Follow-up on those those are not at worship.
- 14. Life groups with 100% participation.
- 15. Three "Bring your Neighbor" days.
- 16. Six out reach to community opportunities. i.e. FPU, Dynamic Marriage, etc.
- 17. Update TV ads, 12 new ads, and air 30 times per mo.
- 18. All members complete, or update SHAPE assessment.
- 19. Begin Prison ministry.
